

# 2013 United States Bankruptcy Court Pro Bono Recognition Awards

## Program Overview

In furtherance of Canon 4A of the Code of Conduct for United States Judges and Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court Rule 4.1 (Voluntary Pro Bono Publico Service), the Pro Bono Legal Services Advisory Committee of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Massachusetts will present awards to individual lawyers, law firms, government attorneys, corporate law departments, law students, law schools, legal service agencies and other institutions in the legal profession that have demonstrated outstanding commitment to volunteer legal services to the poor and economically disadvantaged throughout the District of Massachusetts. The awards will be presented in a ceremony at the John Joseph Moakley United States Courthouse in Boston on October 23, 2013 in conjunction with the American Bar Association's recognition of October as National Pro Bono Month. At least four regional awards will be given: Western Division, Central Division, Eastern Division and the Cape, Islands/South Coast Region.

## The Recognition Awards

The Recognition Award Program seeks to identify and honor individual lawyers, law firms, government attorneys, corporate law departments, law students, law schools and other institutions in the legal profession who have improved the availability of or delivered volunteer legal services in the District of Massachusetts. The Awards recognize those who have served their local communities as well as assisted in the administration of justice in the United States Bankruptcy Court. The services are of critical importance to the increasing number of people who need counsel and expertise to navigate an often complex and complicated legal terrain in a challenging economic climate.

## Criteria

Award recipients will be selected from those who have excelled in providing volunteer services in one or more of the following ways:

1. Volunteer participation in activities or pro bono programs which resulted in satisfying previously unmet needs or in extending services to underserved residents of the District;
2. Successfully litigating pro bono cases in the United States Bankruptcy Court that favorably affect economically disadvantaged individuals and/or
3. Successfully achieved legislation that contributed substantially to legal services to the indigent.

As this is the first year of the award program, pro bono activities rendered from January 1, 2011 through and including June 30, 2013 will be considered for eligibility.

## Nomination Guidelines

- Please submit a brief narrative explaining how the candidate meets the criteria for The Recognition Awards. The narrative should specify the nature of the pro bono contributions and identify those who have benefited.
- Supporting information should include the nominee's principal areas of practice, the number of years practicing law, time spent on pro bono activities, other public service contributions, educational background, bar association activities and supporting documents.
- Include at least three (3) letters of support from other individuals and organizations who are aware of the candidate's pro bono contribution. Self-nominations will be considered.
- Nominations submitted in 2013 remain active for consideration in the 2014 Awards program provided that the nominating party submits a letter restating the intent to nominate the candidate and updating the narrative with any relevant information.
